CALL FOR PAPERS

The organisers are pleased to invite Papers for the **Mechanics' Institutes Australia 2018** Conference at Ballarat, Victoria, 16-18 November 2018.

The theme is **Celebration and Survival** and we welcome Papers in these ranging areas.

This year **Celebrates**: the 20th Anniversary of the Mechanics' Institutes of Victoria; and the centenary of the Armistice of World War I, an event which was celebrated in many Institute Halls, a great number of which hold Honour Rolls. It also celebrates the great International Mechanics' Institute Movement which was largely spawned from the foundation of the Edinburgh School of Arts in 1821 and the resultant legacy of the thousands of Institutes that still exist around the world in their various forms.

And for **Survival**, we would welcome ways and means—past, present and future—of how Institutes have **Survived**, and will continue to **Survive** into the future. (It is noted that the whole of the Saturday afternoon will be made over to a joint session on the Maintenance, Management, Marketing and Survival of Institutes with a range of specialist presenters.)

We would also welcome Papers on events, organisations, people and/or activities that generally took place in Institutes or notable legal cases connected with them.

Mechanics' Institutes Australia 2018 is being sponsored by the **Mechanics' Institutes of Victoria Inc.** and is being supported by the **Sydney Mechanics' School of Arts Inc., Government of Victoria, Ballarat Mechanics' Institute Inc., The Melbourne Athenaeum Incorporated** and **J. The Conference will be held at Ballarat Mechanics' Institute, 117-119 Sturt Street, Ballarat over three days 16-18 November 2018. Papers will be presented at one of three parallel sessions and will be printed prior to the event. (19 November is a tour of Melbourne Institutes.)

The Closing Date for Abstracts is 30 June 2018 and these will be acknowledged as accepted. **The final Paper must be submitted by 30 September 2018** in electronic format to the above address or MIA 2018 Conference Secretariat, 29 Lisbeth Avenue, Donvale, V 3111, Australia. This will enable presentation of your Paper at **MIA 2018.**
